Message from Rev'd Paul Smith

My Dear Friends,

I welcome the invitation to write for the Clarion because it gives me the opportunity to introduce myself to the whole Circuit. When it became clear that Ken Gowland would be leaving our District Chair, Rev Dan Haylett, rang me and asked if I could help. I gladly agreed to do so. Ringsash is a circuit which I have held in high regard for a long time. I have known the joy of leading a few weekends away for your circuit as well as preaching in some of your churches



from time to time, so some already know me a little. My hope is that those who know me already will know me a bit better when you've read this and those who have yet to meet me will either anticipate or dread the potential encounter!

A Yorkshire man by birth, I grew up in a North Country industrial town and like many others knew several lost years when I was a teenager. I was drawn back into the life of the church through the witness and invitation of a Christian schoolteacher. To everyone's surprise I found my place in a vibrant central hall where the evening congregations exceeded 1500. It was through this witness that I gave my life to Christ and began to know the transforming power of His love.

In 1968 I went as a student to Cliff College and then after a one year course moved on to London Bible College to improve my theological education. Whilst I was studying there I lived in student accommodation in the east end of London and quickly became involved in the work of the Methodist Missions at Bow and Whitechapel, working mostly amongst the poor and marginalized. Once again I saw in down to earth practical ways the transforming love of God, and it was through that ministry that I felt called to offer my life as a Methodist Minister. To my surprise and delight I was accepted and embarked upon a training programme at Wesley
